BCPS' fine arts programs continue to shine. Byron Center High School's Jazz Orchestra is performing at a high level. Students got the opportunity to be the opening act for world-renowned trumpeter Wynton Marsalis at his concert in Ann Arbor. In addition, the JO is traveling to New York City to compete yet again in the Essentially Ellington Jazz Band Competition. Our talented student artists are also getting the recognition they deserve. The Michigan Art Education Association selected 53 students' artwork to be featured at the Region 9 art show.

Byron Center athletics had great accomplishments this winter season. The boys swim/dive team finished second in the state finals. Multiple student-athletes qualified for state competition in bowling, wrestling and swim/dive. The boys basketball team had a historic run, winning the regional championship for the first time since 1986. In addition, BCHS Athletic Director Brady Lake earned the honor of MIAAA Regional Athletic Director of the Year and Director of Strength and Conditioning Joe Chiaramonte was named Regional Strength Coach of the Year.

As we look towards the future, we continue to monitor the growth throughout Byron Center. National Merit Scholarship

Byron Center High School seniors Simon Kramer, Abigail Van Loozenoord and Emma Wiechertjes have been named National Merit Scholarship finalists. Students enter the National Merit Scholarship program when they take the PSAT/NMSQT in the fall of their junior year. Semifinalists are the

highest-scoring program entrants in each state and represent less than one percent of the nation's seniors.

Finalists have to have an outstanding academic record, be endorsed by a high school official and complete a detailed scholarship application, providing information about extracurricular activities and leadership positions. There are around 7,000 finalists across the globe each year.

Jazz Orchestra to Essentially Ellington

The Byron Center High School Jazz Orchestra has been selected for the Essentially Ellington 30th Anniversary High School Jazz Band Competition and Festival in New York City. Essentially Ellington is a program for high school jazz bands that aims to elevate musicianship, broaden perspectives and inspire performance. This is the eighth time in school history the Jazz Orchestra has been invited to the event.

To prepare for the competition, the Jazz at Lincoln Center sent American clarinetist Walter Blanding to mentor the students.

In addition, the Jazz Orchestra got the honor to be the opening act for highly respected trumpeter and composer Wynton Marsalis at his concert in Ann Arbor.







Solo & Ensemble Festival

Byron Center High School band and orchestra students performed at the State Solo and Ensemble Festival in 45 different events. Of the 45 events, 30 groups received first division ratings and 15 received second division ratings.

"Performing at this state level event is a tremendous honor and our students met with a tremendous amount of success," Fine Arts Director Marc Townley said.

In addition, the BCHS Clarinet Choir received a first division rating at the State Solo and Ensemble Festival and was named one of the top Chamber Ensembles in the state of Michigan.

West Middle School Choirs earned Division 1 - Excellent ratings at the Michigan School Vocal Music Association Choral Festival. The students finished the competition with some of the highest scores given throughout the festival.

Nickels Sixth Grade Girls Choir



The Nickels Intermediate sixth grade girls choir sang at the District Choral Festival for the first time in over a decade, earning high scores from every judge that added up to a "1" ranking.

Scholastic Art Awards

Byron Center Public Schools students were awarded 28 Scholastic Art & Writing Awards. The Scholastic Art & Writing Awards is the nation's longest-running program that recognizes creative teens in 28 different art and writing categories.





West Middle School students earned 20 awards;

including one gold key, five silver keys and 14 honorable mentions. Byron Center High School students won eight awards; including two gold keys, two silver keys and four honorable mentions.







Michigan Art Education Association Art Show

Byron Center Public Schools had 53 students' artwork selected to be represented at the Michigan Art Education Association Region 9 art show. This artwork came from students K-12, showing a variety of talent and creativity.

"The artwork demonstrates some of the best examples of creativity and craft our students have exhibited this school year," West Middle School Visual Arts Teacher Janine Campbell said. "We are so inspired by the work our students create and appreciate the opportunity for them to share their vision and shine."

Some of the student artwork was selected for the MAEA state show earning top 100, top 18 and MDE awards.

Byron Center High School Theatre presented *High School Musical On Stage!* The production was made up of 58 cast members, including a freshman and sophomore lead character and 31 crew members. Students had the chance to perform shows over two weekends.
