Countryside named 2025 Blue Ribbon School

Countryside Elementary has been named a 2025 Blue Ribbon School! Countryside was one of only 16 Michigan schools recognized at the highest performing level this year by the Michigan Department of Education (MDE).

The Blue Ribbon Schools Program honors public and private elementary, middle and high schools for their academic excellence and progress in closing achievement gaps among student subgroups. Each year, the Department of Education celebrates schools that demonstrate that all students can achieve high levels of success. MDE nominated Countryside as an Exemplary High-Performing School, placing it among the state's top-performing schools based on state and national assessments.

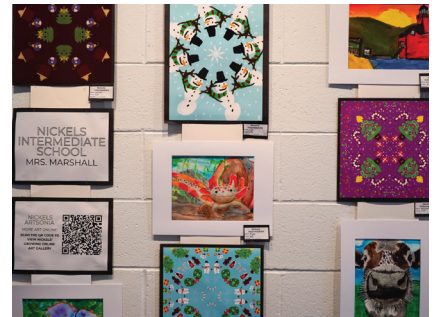
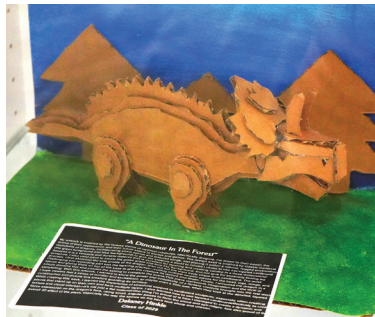


Elementary Choir Performs National Anthem

The showcase provided a wonderful opportunity for families and community members to experience the imagination, skill and artistic growth of our young creators.

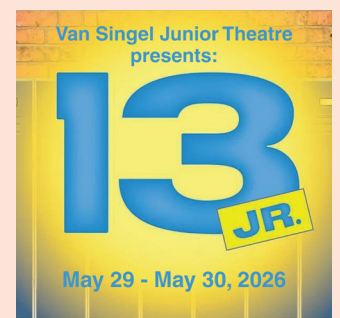
Byron Center Theatre

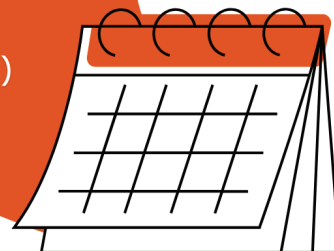
