Attendance

Attendance is very important for the academic success of your student and Marshall wants to ensure your child is getting the most out of their learning opportunities. Marshall has returned to pre-pandemic attendance guidelines and will be communicating with families if students are chronically absent or tardy. The following parameters will be used to determine chronic absenteeism/tardiness:

- Students who are absent or tardy more than 10% of school days will receive a notification letter.
- If attendance problems persist, the school will call for a meeting where an attendance contract will be developed.
- If the agreed upon parameters of the contract are not met, students/families will be referred to the Kent County Truancy Office for further problem solving.

In an effort to ensure consistent attendance for your child, please consider:

- Sending your child to school unless they are truly sick, such as fever, vomiting, diarrhea or contagious infections.
- Avoiding travel or appointments during school days/hours.
- Sticking with a morning routine including a healthy breakfast and a consistent bedtime schedule avoiding late night screen time or electronic devices.
- Have a back-up plan for unexpected morning delays to ensure your child gets to school on time.
- Communicate with the school regarding student absences.

Finally, please continue to contact the school in advance if your child is going to be absent or as soon as possible with unexpected absences.
