Parent/Teacher Conferences

Teachers have already sent out sign-ups for PTC directly to parents. You will schedule your conferences with your child's teacher. If you need to make a change to your scheduled time, please contact the teacher directly.

- Thursday, October 23 from 1:00-4:00pm and 5:00-8:00pm.
- We have switched our grading to Semesters Report cards will come home in January.
- There will not be a separate conference sign up for Art, Music or PE. The teachers will be available during PTC times if you'd like to stop by their rooms.

We look forward to this time to discuss your student's progress with you. Here are some helpful hints for a successful conference:

- **Be on Time** Plan to arrive a little early. Teachers work hard to stick to the 15 minute time allotted, so arriving and leaving on-time keeps everyone on schedule.
- **Be a Team** Partnering with your child's teacher helps you both to provide consistent support for your child.
- **Prepare Questions in Advance** Coming with specific questions will help make the most of your time together.
- **Keep Teachers Informed** Let your child's teacher know about any situation at home that may affect your child's school work (such as a death in the family, a new baby, or a change in daycare arrangements, etc.)
- Take Notes & Leave with a Plan Taking notes will help you remember what was discussed and what was agreed upon.








SCHOOL BUS SAFETY WEEK

SPIRIT DAYS TO PROMOTE SCHOOL BUS SAFETY



Man

Wear all Red day!

A school bus acts as a traffic signal when its lights are activated. Red flashing lights and extended stop arms indicate the bus has stopped and children are getting on or off. All cars must stop and wait until the red lights stop flashing, the extended stop-arm is withdrawn, and the bus begins moving, before they can start driving again.



Safety yellow or orange day!

Yellow flashing lights indicate the bus is preparing to stop to load or unload children. Cars should slow down and prepare to stop their vehicle. Remember, it's not just the bus that people need to have their eyes on – but the surrounding area too. Children are waiting to board or get off the bus and are near our roadways.



Mismatch shoes or socks day!

Remember you should NEVER walk behind a school bus. If you must cross the street in front of the bus, be sure to place yourself at least ten feet — five giant steps — in front of the bus before crossing. This keeps you out of the danger zone of the school bus.



Wear your sunglasses to school!

When entering or exiting the bus be sure to look both ways upon entering the roadway. Even when you see the driver put their paddle up indicating it's safe to cross, it's always smart to be extra cautious and look once more. Always have your eyes watching for traffic not following laws, your bus driver is trained to keep you safe but it takes your help to ensure a safe stop!



Crazy hair or hat day!

Running after the bus is crazy! You should arrive at the bus stop at least five minutes before the bus is scheduled to arrive. Traffic can make morning times vary, we try our best to be there within 5 minutes before or after our published route times. NEVER chase the bus, your bus driver cannot see you! Instead, if you need a ride then please have a parent call the transportation department and we will see how we can help get you to school safely that day.
