Cell Phone Expectations and Consequences:

Our policy states that all cell phones must be off and stored in a student's locker (or homeroom teacher's classroom) from 7:30-2:50 each day. This policy is a three strike system. Please review the consequences below with your student to ensure understanding of cell phone use at school.

Cell Phone Policy (Electronic Device Policy)

1st Offense – Device is taken away for the remainder of the day.

2nd Offense – Device is taken away, parents are called, and parents must come pick up device from school.

3rd Offense – Parent is called and device is banned permanently from the school for the remainder of the year.

Our goal with this policy is to help all students focus on learning throughout the school day. Thank you for partnering with us!

School Closing Menu Procedure:

What is on the lunch menu when students come back to school after an unscheduled school closing, for example a snow day? The lunch planned for the "Snow Day" menu is served the next day school resumes. The kitchen staff prepare a day in advance therefore the food for the "Snow Day" menu is already prepped and ready to cook. For example: school is canceled on Tuesday and resumes on Wednesday, Tuesday's lunch is served on Wednesday when the students return. Wednesday's lunch will be SKIPPED entirely. On Thursday, we will be back on schedule with Thursday's menu.

SCHOOL CLOSURE FOR MULTIPLE DAYS:

- In the event the school closes for consecutive days in a row, no hot lunch will be served during that time.
- When school opens up the following procedure will be followed: The lunch that was to be served on the first snow day will be served and then the current menu will be followed for the following school day.

For example: If the school closes on Monday and resumes on a Wednesday the lunch will be what was on Monday. Then the calendar menu will pick back up for the following day (what the lunch choice would be on Thursday).

Medication Policy Reminders:

- 1. If your student needs to take medication while at school they MUST have a medication consent form completed. Prescription meds require BOTH a parent/guardian AND a physician signature. Over the counter (OTC) meds require a parent/guardian signature only. No student will be administered medication without the proper consent forms.
- 2. Please remember that students are NOT allowed to self carry ANY medications (prescription or OTC) per our district policy UNLESS it's an emergency medication and we have the appropriate forms completed and signed.
- 3. All medications must be stored in the office and brought to school by a parent/guardian. They must be in the original container with the appropriate label (and not expired). Hand 2 Hand:


Dear Parent/Guardian:

We would like to offer your student the opportunity to participate in a program at Nickels Intermediate called "Hand2Hand". This program helps provide a student with food/snacks for the weekends!

Here's how Hand2Hand will work: At the end of the week students who are signed up will receive a minimum of 10 food items in a black school logo drawstring bag that will be provided at the first week of participation (subsequent weeks will be a plastic bag). These food items will be a combination of breakfast, snacks, lunch and/or dinner items. While the food items are meant for the student, they can be shared among the family as well. (Please note: if your student or another family member has food allergies it will be the responsibility of the parent/guardian to check the contents of the backpack each week to ensure the food doesn't contain ingredients which could cause an allergic reaction).

There is no cost to participate! If you sign your student up to receive Hand2Hand, they will continue to receive the weekly bags each week. Student Pick up and Drop off (New Driveway Entrance for Nickels):



Dear Parents and Guests-

The following diagram shows the directional flow of how pickup, drop-off, and parking will occur before, during and after school at Nickels Intermediate. Please note that the pickup/drop-off lanes directly in front of the building are one way and counter-clockwise. Students should exit to the sidewalk on the passenger side of your vehicle. Please be sure to pull forward if space allows along the curb. Once your student is safely dropped off, it is ok to pull out into the exit lanes. Do not use the middle lane for entering Nickel's driveway. Please continue to use the designated drop off/pick up loop when dropping off or picking up your student at school. Please do not use the bus loop (west of the school), the main drive between West and Nickels.

After school dismissal, students at Nickels will get on a transfer bus and ride it over to the bus rodeo (located at Heritage Elementary), students will transfer to their home bus at this location. In the past, some parents came to the bus transfer area (bus rodeo) to pick up their kids. We are asking that you avoid picking up your students from the bus transfer area. Our bus riders will load and unload buses on the far west side of the building in a separate and protected lot designated for this purpose. When picking up your student at the end of the school day please exit towards 84th street.

Family Tech Tip #4:

Have your first family tech talk about using technology as a tool.

The Toolbox Lesson: Have a family chat about using technology with purpose! Grab paper or a whiteboard and draw a line down the middle, making a "+" column and a "-" column. Start a conversation with your kids by asking: "How is a device like a tool, such as a hammer?" Just as a hammer can build or break, technology can help or harm.

Fill the "+" column by asking: What do you like about technology? What do you enjoy doing on devices? Then move to the "-" column: What are some downsides we should watch out for? What worries you about technology? Teens especially appreciate being asked for their perspective and insights on digital life.

End by discussing: How can we use technology as a tool that helps us? This builds digital discernment— the ability to make good technology choices. Research shows that families who have regular conversations about technology <u>develop healthier digital habits</u>, and children who <u>think through decisions ahead of time</u> make better choices.
