Family Tech Tip #2:

Use devices in shared spaces, not in bedrooms or bathrooms.

Why? We need to protect our kids' time, sleep, and values. Screens used in isolation, without purpose, can lead to:

- Curiosity clicks: The internet isn't always the best first teacher.
- Unhealthy escapes: Boredom can brew digital black holes when kids escape to a screen.
- Counterfeit connections: Loneliness leads to looking. Looking for approval, acceptance, and friendship—often in the wrong places online.

My kids or teens won't go for this. How can I teach them the "why" behind tech-free zones?

Have conversations about the research and best practices:

- The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) and the American Academy of Sleep Medicine (AASM)
 recommend no screen-based devices in children's and teen's bedrooms and turning them off one hour
 before bedtime.
- Many organizations and studies have found that parental screen limitations and the absence of screens in bedrooms have been found to significantly reduce screen usage.
- Recent research shows a clear link between kids using screens and their sleep habits. When looking at many studies on this topic, almost all of them (90%) found the same thing: kids who use screens tend to go to bed later and get less sleep overall. This includes devices like phones, tablets, and TVs.

As parents, we can create boundaries that help to keep our kids safe and healthy. Keeping devices in open areas saves our relationships, sleep, mental health, posture, productivity, and our values.

The best part is when you commit as a family to use screen-approved zones in your home, everyone benefits. The reality is, boundaries keep ALL of us safe—kids and adults.

Cell Phone Expectations and Consequences:

Our policy states that all cell phones must be off and stored in a student's locker (or homeroom teacher's classroom) from 7:30-2:50 each day. This policy is a three strike system. Please review the consequences below with your student to ensure understanding of cell phone use at school.

Cell Phone Policy (Electronic Device Policy)

1st Offense – Device is taken away for the remainder of the day.

2nd Offense – Device is taken away, parents are called, and parents must come pick up device from school.

3rd Offense – Parent is called and device is banned permanently from the school for the remainder of the year.

Our goal with this policy is to help all students focus on learning throughout the school day. Thank you for partnering with us!

Hand 2 Hand:

Dear Parent/Guardian:

We would like to offer your student the opportunity to participate in a program at Nickels Intermediate called "Hand2Hand". This program helps provide a student with food/snacks for the weekends!

Here's how Hand2Hand will work: At the end of the week students who are signed up will receive a minimum of 10 food items in a black school logo drawstring bag that will be provided at the first week of participation (subsequent weeks will be a plastic bag). These food items will be a combination of breakfast, snacks, lunch and/or dinner items. While the food items are meant for the student, they can be shared among the family as well. (Please note: if your student or another family member has food allergies it will be the responsibility of the parent/guardian to check the contents of the backpack each week to ensure the food doesn't contain ingredients which could cause an allergic reaction).

There is no cost to participate! If you sign your student up to receive Hand2Hand, they will continue to receive the weekly bags each week. Medication Policy Reminders:


1. If your student needs to take medication while at school they MUST have a medication consent form completed.

Prescription meds require BOTH a parent/guardian AND a physician signature. Over the counter (OTC) meds require a parent/guardian signature only. No student will be administered medication without the proper consent forms.

- 2. Please remember that students are NOT allowed to self carry ANY medications (prescription or OTC) per our district policy UNLESS it's an emergency medication and we have the appropriate forms completed and signed.
- 3. All medications must be stored in the office and brought to school by a parent/guardian. They must be in the original container with the appropriate label (and not expired). We will not accept any medications in baggies, envelopes, etc.

Student Pick up and Drop off (New Driveway Entrance for Nickels):



Dear Parents and Guests-

The following diagram shows the directional flow of how pickup, drop-off, and parking will occur before, during and after school at Nickels Intermediate. Please note that the pickup/drop-off lanes directly in front of the building are one way and counter-clockwise. Students should exit to the sidewalk on the passenger side of your vehicle. Please be sure to pull forward if space allows along the curb. Once your student is safely dropped off, it is ok to pull out into the exit lanes. Do not use the middle lane for entering Nickel's driveway. Please continue to use the designated drop off/pick up loop when dropping off or picking up your student at school. Please do not use the bus loop (west of the school), the main drive between West and Nickels.

After school dismissal, students at Nickels will get on a transfer bus and ride it over to the bus rodeo (located at Heritage Elementary), students will transfer to their home bus at this location. In the past, some parents came to the bus transfer area (bus rodeo) to pick up their kids. We are asking that you avoid picking up your students from the bus transfer area. Our bus riders will load and unload buses on the far west side of the building in a separate and protected lot designated for this purpose. When picking up your student at the end of the school day please exit towards 84th street.
